

Traveling with Toddlers

Play with your toddler

- When you hear sounds like a car horn, copy them and have your child make the sound.
- Point to signs and tell your child what they say. For example, “Look, that red sign says STOP!”
- While driving, look out the window and talk about what you see.
- Show your child the traffic lights and talk about what the colors mean.
- Talk with your child about the weather.

Talk and rhyme with your toddler

I’m a windshield wiper (bend arm at elbow with fingers pointing up)
This is how I go (move arm left and right, pivoting at elbow)
Back and forth, back and forth (continue back and forth motion)
In the rain and snow. (continue back and forth motion)
