


PROGRAMS | WINTER 2021-2022

Disappearance of Flight 2501 Tuesday, Jan. 25, 6:30 PM

On June 23, 1950, Northwest Airlines Flight 2501, a DC-4 with 58 souls on board, disappeared over Lake Michigan. 
