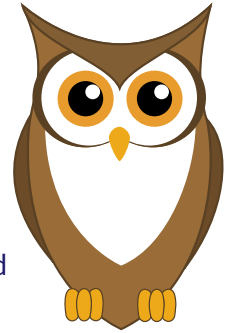

Disappearance of Flight 2501

Deadline for film submission is Friday, Jan. 21. Selected films will be screened at Celebration Cinema GR North.

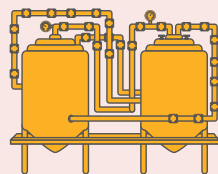
