Mother Bear has the prefect answers to quell his inquiries and get her young one down for their long nap.

This book creates an opportunity for the children in your life to ask questions about winter animals and how they prepare for the season. After reading about little cub's winter nap, they might even embrace their own rest times!

Sung Na illustrates the passage of seasons for young children. With a white rabbit as a guide, readers learn the different responses creatures have to winter and the wait for spring.

Take some time with the child in your life to linger over the pictures in this book. What animals can you spot and name? How are their responses to winter similar or different to your own? For a fun look at book design, explore the front and back covers of the book with the child in your life: You'll find winter rabbit on one side and spring rabbit on the other!
